THEN ACHARYALU QUESTIONS, RATHER ARGUES IN THE NAME OF MIMAMSA THAT INTELLIGENT BEINGS ARE CAPABLE OF STORING THE ENERGY BY REPEATING MANTRAS TO REALISE BRAHMAN. TO THIS GURUVARU (RAGHAVENDRA) REPLIES: THERE IS NO QUESTION OF AN OVERHEAD TANK FOR YOU TO STORE THE ENERGY. LOVE IS NOT STORED ENERGY – LOVE AND COMPASSION ARE SUPPOSED TO BE SPONTANEOUS.

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This incident happened around six months back at Guruji's house. Mukund mama, the elder brother of Guruji, is now into his nineties and sleeps most of the time. He has suffered bad patches of health in the last few years although his parameters are normal. Jalaja mami (his and Guruji's sister), is his caretaker. She has devoted herself to this task the way a mother takes care of the child.

Mukund mama had started coughing. It was night time, approximately 11 pm or so. The cough which was well spaced at first, become more and more frequent.

Jalaja mami lying on her bed, started tossing around. She had had a tiring day and had looked forward to a good night's rest. The coughing by Mukund mama had woken her up.

Normally Mukund mama was prone to a lot of coughing but it would subside on its own. Coughing was not something she was worried about per se and she would fall asleep most times even if he coughed.

This time however the cough appeared to be continuous. After some time it increased in intensity. She got up and gave warm water for him to drink. She went back to sleep. The bouts of coughing did not abate.

Two hours must have elapsed when Jalaja mami began to realize that she had lost her sleep completely. The intensity of coughing also started increasing and Mukund mama was having more and more struggle every time he tried to cough.

Frustration was building up in her. It must have been about 1 a.m. that finally she decided that enough was enough. She got up and went to the main room which includes the Pooja room where Guruji's photo has been kept.

"Govardhana", she called out loudly, "Why are You doing this to me? I am not able to sleep. I don't know what You do but do something about the coughing of Mukund mama. It has become very bad." She started admonishing Guruji. "You are not taking care of Mukunda. I have lost my sleep completely because of You. I do not know how, but You have to make him stop coughing."

Jalaja mami has this practice of speaking loudly to the photo of Guruji when occasion arose. It need not be a problem situation always – it could be telling Guruji to bless some couple on their getting married,

or for children appearing in exams; even if she makes a social visit, she will go inform the 'photo' and then go out. Her faith in Guruji is so strong, she believes that Guruji listens and responds and any problem can be left best to Him to redress by this manner of communication.

Satisfied that Guruji had heard her, she turned and started walking towards her bed. She heard a voice. The voice merely said "Ambrolite-S." She heard distinctly this word, with a very emphatic stress on 'S' in Ambrolite-S.

For a minute she stood still, astonished that she had heard something. She had not expected any voice to be heard. But her mind was not on the voice. She had her mind working furiously to decipher what she had heard. Suddenly like a flash of lightning it dawned on her. Ambrolite - S was the syrup which had been prescribed by the doctor for cough. For a very long time this syrup was never used and Jalaja mami had even forgotten its existence. But now she was able to distinctly recall the name and the application.

Rushing to switch on the tubelight, she went to the cupboard and searched. She knew where it was kept. The syrup was administered to Mukund mama. Immediately his coughing stopped.

Jalaja went back to her sleep, more tired than before but with a sense of immense relief that she had laid her hands on a solution for Mukund mama's coughing should this recur in future. Probably she did not realize that apart from this achievement, she had proved to herself what unshakeable faith in Guruji does to the devotee. She had received Guruji's communication instantly!

She is not able to place the voice. She does not think it was the voice of Guruji – which she proudly says she can recognise any day anywhere. But that does not matter to her. Her problem was solved by Guruji. What a sensation – she spoke to Guruji and got a response. Should she not feel thrilled about it? Yes. Although she does not gloat over the fact that she heard the voice, somewhere this episode touched her deeply. She brings it up in her conversation with other devotees when she talks about how Guruji takes care.

There have been other examples she gives about how her 'communication methodology' has given answers in other problem-situations. But that is not for now. Those instances could be reserved for future issues of Satsanga.

### News from Alamadhi

The fury of Nature seen in December 2015 and December 2016 (Cyclone Vardha) has cumulatively dealt a nasty blow to our Alamadhi Centre. The compound wall collapsed at several places.

The current financial year is witnessing a painful attempt to dress up our wounds. The priority has changed from developing further our activities to putting proper infrastructure firmly on ground.

The cost of building walls is Rs. 45 lakhs including compound walls for two plots outside the main Centre. It would have been impossible to undertake such a task in this financial year due to the enormity of the project. By the grace of Guruji one well-wisher has come forward to sponsor this entire project over a span of two years. Work is in progress.

### From the Doctor's Desk.



Every year Feb. 19th is a time for self-appraisal in the sense what have we done in the by-gone year and what more should we do.

Looking back it is gratifying to know that two of our projects started in a small way are national projects. The girl child project and Ruebella vaccination project are taken up in a big way by the govt. and Ruebella vaccine is now being administered along with measles vaccine all over the country.

But more important is the success that we have achieved in treating polycystic ovarian diseases which is a major cause of infertility. A number of women yearning for a child attend our Gandhinagar peripheral clinic. Ten such patients were investigated and followed up. Six of them conceived and two have delivered. I will now briefly write about the two lucky ladies in this and the next issue of Satsanga.

First patient is Mahalakshmi, a 26-year old lady, married for five years, anxious to conceive. Both she and her partner were investigated and she was found to have Polycystic Ovarian Disease (PCOD). She was started on Metformin tablets. Within two months of therapy she conceived and went through a normal pregnancy. But her baby was extremely small at the time of birth. The baby weighed just 1.5 kgs at birth and had to be in NICU for nearly three months. After discharge from the hospital he is growing normally, though some effects of extreme low birth weight are still there.
