‘Amma naaku aakhali avuthundhi annam pettu’ (This is Telugu and it means “Mother I am feeling hungry. Please give me some food to eat.”)

This was the plea made by a small frail looking girl to Mrs. Jagadeshwari, wife of late Yadagiri Rao, *DMS* member. This incident must have taken place in the mid-eighties. Yadagiri Rao and his family were very greatly devoted to Guruji. They lived at Hyderabad and the house where they stayed then had been taken on rent.

The small girl asking for food was not a real person from the neighbourhood; it was a dream Jagadeshwari used to get frequently. In the dream she would find this small girl appearing in front of her and asking Jagadeshwari to give food.

Over a period of time this dream started causing concern. It was occurring with a certain regularity and the sequence was fairly the same. Was something wrong inside the house, was there a spirit or was it just the imagination of Jagadeshwari? But then, she was not the type of person to imagine or suffer from hallucinations.

Another family very devoted to Guruji was incidentally living very close to their house – SPL Narasimhan and Vimala. Vimala and Jagadeshwari were very pally and so Jagadeshwari decided to pour her heart out. Next time Vimala visited her, she narrated her peculiar experience. Instead of getting a consoling answer from Vimala, Jagadeshwari was stunned when Vimala told her that she too had the same kind of experience. Vimala too was getting dreams – of identical nature, that of a small girl appearing in the dreams asking her to give some food.

Two friends in distress, they felt comforted by each other’s predicament. But they also thought of the same solution – next time Guruji visited Hyderabad, they would talk to Him and take His advice.

Accordingly when Guruji dropped in after some weeks, they narrated their experience. Guruji went into prayers. After a while opening His eyes He said:

There is a well in the backyard of the house. At the time the construction was going on for building the house the labourers had been camping at the same place to complete the work. There was alot of water in the well then. One of the kids there, the daughter of a labourer had fallen into the well and died. In due course the work was completed and the labourers moved out. The spirit of the child who died there lingered on there. The dream that both Jagadeshwari and Vimala used to get, was the spirit of this girl.

“I have prayed and given emancipation to the soul of this child. She will not hereafter appear in your dreams” Guruji reassured.

There are many instances of Guruji dealing with similar happenings. And indeed many qualify to be top class suspense thrillers!

Guruji has told us that no evil spirit can stand against the force of Rudra. Chanting of Maha Rudram ensures that no evil force can enter your house. Equally powerful is the chanting of Hanuman Chalisa.

Holy sindoor from the temple of Lord Hanuman from (Sankat Vimochan temple, Varanasi) is being sent alongwith the hard copy of Satsanga.

Report from Doctor's Desk

Feb 19th reminds us to rededicate ourselves to the principles and positive teachings of revered Guruji on the anniversary of His Vighram Installation.

We take stock of the positives and negatives of our activities for the medical centre. It was a year of slow but steady progress. Besides treating sick patients, *DMS* gave antenatal checkup

and care for pregnant mothers, immunization and nutritional guidance for project Kamakshi children. The students attending coaching classes too were given checkup and immunization.

Project Kamakshi now has 730 children and 900 cases have been registered. Those children are weighed periodically, vitamins, and deworming tablets and supplements are given. Mothers are counseled periodically on nutrition and demonstrations are given on preparing nutritious diets from cheap and locally available vegetables.

World breast feed week was celebrated in the first week of August 2012. Fifty mothers and children participated. Two eminent Pediatricians were invited as guests to judge the best exclusively breast fed babies and to address the mothers of the importance of breast feeds. Prizes were given to their best babies and gifts to all participants. Students enacted skits, painted posters and took part in oratorical contests-all highlighting the significance of mother feeds.

The Ghandhinagar centre which was not functioning for 2 years was revived on Feb 9th 2013 with a free camp for women and children.

Two cases need special mention. One is narrated below and the other in the next issue of Satsanga. Both are children having problem relating to eye. The first case being narrated here is the granddaughter of our nurse Poongothai. The name of the child is Jennifar. She could not see in the darkness, but had normal day vision. This condition is called night blindness. She was diagnosed to have “retinitis pigmentosa” an autosomal recessive conditions in which the “Rods” in the retina do not develop. Rods are necessary for dark vision. In retinitis pigmentosa the rods are not only poorly developed but also undergo degeneration. These autosomal recessive diseases occur when blood relatives marry. In their child’s case the father is the mother’s maternal uncle.

Their child was fully investigated and large dose of Vitamin A which are necessary for rods were given. She started improving and is able to see partially in darkness.

The main agenda for 19th Feb was to get the Kamakshi Baba Hospital project going and make it a reality. The plans must get approved, funds must be mobilized and other infrastructure facilities must be procured with Guruji’s blessings and support from the devotees. The dream should be realized in as short a span of time as possible.
